Parent Participation

Parent participation is a vital part of SCS's success. Parents are encouraged to participate in all aspects of the school, to the mutual benefit of parent and child. It takes a village to raise a child. Certain minimum participation is required, as described below.

- Parent Hours: Each family is encouraged to assign themselves a job for their hours. These may vary with the talents, interests, and time individual parents have to contribute. School hours are such that some are take home projects, during one season, in the evenings or at school events like open streets. Families will be asked to help 10 hours a school year.
- Weekend Work Sessions: Saturday or Sunday work sessions are scheduled throughout the school year to keep the school clean and repaired. Each family will be asked to attend two Saturday or Sunday work sessions per year.
- **Fundraising:** Fundraising is essential to the operation of the school. Families are strongly encouraged to participate in all fundraising activities including the annual Gala. Support of Fundraising activities is in addition to your family's School hours/jobs & Saturday work sessions.

Fundraising

Scisstorail Children's School Holiday Program 2019/2020

The Scissortail Children's School calendar is modeled after typical school calendars, with extended breaks for holidays and time for professional learning/development for our faculty. However, we do understand that for some of our families, such breaks pose a severe hardship in arranging alternative care. In response to Scissortail family requests, we are offering a "Holiday Program" to help ease the burden of finding additional care.

The Holiday Program provides care for SCS children up to 18 extra days during the school year for an extra fee. Families MUST pre-register for the Holiday Program. Deadline to register for the Fall Holiday Program is SEPTEMBER 20th. Deadline to register for the Spring Holiday Program is FEBRUARY 18th. Space is very limited and attendance is determined on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Children's School

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Our Mission

Scissortail Children's School is an inclusive early childhood education program providing high-quality, progressive programs for children 6 weeks through age six and their families.

Our School Structure

Scissortail Children's School is a progressive school that serves children in SW Oklahoma who are 6 weeks-6 years of age. Our school opens at 7:30am for early care and school begins at 8:30am. Our school day ends at 3:15 with late care ending at 5:30pm daily.

Early & Late Care

Early and late care are provided as a convenience to our families. During these non-school times, activities and supervision are provided by one teacher and one or more teacher assistant. Activities during these times include: painting/drawing, puzzles and other manipulatives, clay/playdoh, and board games. Weather permitting, children may also be engaging in free-play outside.

Early & Late Care Policy

Late care is provided for a fee and arranged in advance. This is because we must be able to have an appropriate number of faculty available for late care. Please let your child's teacher (verbal or text) or Molly (verbal or email) know if you need late care. We do reserve the right to say no if we cannot provide appropriate supervision.

Early & Late Care Dismissal Policy

You will be required to sign your child out at the front desk before picking up at Late Care. This means if your child is playing in the backyard, you must first come in to the building to sign him/her out at the front desk before staff will release him/her for the day.

Arrival

Please check your child in at the front desk upon arrival to school each day, and then walk your child to the classroom or to the cafe for breakfast, encourage your child to remove their shoes, place them in their cubby area along with their bag/backpack and give them your loving good-bye. Please be sure to sign-in your child on the iPad at the front desk, and share any information necessary with your child's teachers.

Absence

Please contact us if your child is going to be absent from school or if you are going to be over 30 minutes later than your typical arrival time...we will start to worry! You can call the school and leave a message or email us.

Dismissal

You must check your child out at the front desk each day.

Pick-up will occur at either the doorway of your child's classroom, the atelier, or outside, weather permitting. Scissortail Children's School closes at 5:30pm, so please make arrangements for your child to be picked-up on time. Of course, safety is very important and we encourage families to ensure their safe arrival for pick-up (no speeding or reckless driving); therefore, we understand an occasional late pick. Families should contact the school if a late pick-up will occur. However, we want to respect our faculty and their families/schedules/obligations after work...so if late pick-up becomes a pattern, we will meet with your to discuss the situation and possible courses of action. If you are having a friend/family member pick up your child, it is imperative that they are listed as an authorized pick-up in your child's

file. Additionally, this individual must show photo identification. <u>Scissortail</u>

<u>Children's School will not release your child to an unauthorized individual under any circumstances.</u> This policy is for the safety of your child.

Tuition

Scissortail Children's School has a yearly tuition for the school year (August-May). For your convenience, we divide the yearly tuition into 10 equal payments. Tuition is due on the 5th day of each month. Tuition not paid by the 5th of the month will incur a \$20 per day late fee.

Parents will be required to sign a contract for the school year (August-May).

School Schedule and Closings

Regular tuition is due monthly regardless of holidays/closings, planned or otherwise. There are no refunds for these days. There are no refunds for family vacations or other absences. We are closed for traditional holidays and breaks including Veteran's Day, Martin Luther King, Jr. Day, Fall Break, Thanksgiving Break, Winter Break, President's Day and Spring Break. A complete listing of school closings is provided for you in our Scissortail Children's School Calendar. A Scissortail Children's School Calendar is provided to all families and additional copies are available in the office. **Snow Days:** Scissortail Children's School will be closed any day Lawton Public Schools closes for a snow day. School closings are posted on local news media. Scissortail Children's School will also post on their Facebook page and send out a Kaymbu message.

Holiday Program

Families can choose to enroll in our Holiday Program offered during some school holidays/breaks. This program is an additional fee added to your child's tuition. Information will be provided to families in August to enroll for the Fall semester program and January to enroll in the Spring semester program. A complete listing of dates included in the

holiday program is provided for you in our Scissortail Children's School Calendar. The fees for the holiday program are by the day and may vary depending on the number of families electing to attend the day.

Daily Flow

We follow a daily flow of events. A predictable order of events provides a sense of comfort to a child. However, we do not have strict times set for events. For example, we will have breakfast around 8:30. Some days we might delay until 8:45 because the children are so engaged in their morning activities, but we will always clean-up and wash our hands before having snack...so the children have a predictable series of events to expect. Explorations in the morning and afternoon will consists of inside and outside explorations of the environments the faculty have created for the children. As the teachers and children develop relationships and understand their interests, routine will develop.

Child Wellness

In order to provide the optimal learning environment for developing minds and bodies, children are provided healthy meals, creative/active play, adequate rest and positive, nurturing relationships. When children are ill or have experienced a life stressor, we request that your child be at

home, where they are most comfortable and able to receive the quiet, loving attention they need in a less stimulating environment.

Medications

We are required to have your written permission to dispense ANY medication. Medications are kept in the office and out-of-the-reach of children. Please discuss any medication issues with your child's teacher.

Injuries & Medical Emergencies

We are an active preschool. We will explore outside, encountering appropriate risks...and we anticipate that scrapes and bumps might occur during the course of exploration and play. We will use lavender oil, aloe vera and natural products to treat minor skin irritations. All soap, bug spray and sunscreen used are composed of natural products. We have band-aids and a first aid kit available as well. In the event of a medical emergency, we will call 911 and contact you immediately. We are fortunate that the ambulance service is directly across the street if such an event was to occur. Please note that if your child must go to the ER, a caregiver will try to accompany your child if possible (we must keep child/teacher ratios appropriate to ensure the safety of the other children at school).

Illness

If a child develops a temperature of 99.5 or above (a fever) while in our care, you will be contacted and asked to pick up your child. We will not administer Tylenol or Motrin. If a child develops a fever at home, the child must stay home until they have been fever free without fever suppressants for at least 24 hours. If a child begins vomiting while in our care, you will be contacted and asked to pick up your child. If a child begins vomiting at home, they must stay home until they have not vomited for at least 24 hours. If a child develops severe diarrhea (more than 3 loose BMs) while in our care, you will be contacted and asked to pick up your child. If your child develops severe diarrhea while at home,

they must stay home until they have not had loose BMs for at least 24 hours. This policy is to ensure the safety and wellness of all children, families and faculty. We all have children of our own and we have all experienced the stress of having to pick up an ill child from care. Please know we understand the impact and disruption of family schedules when an illness occurs...but we must enforce policies for the health of everyone.

Immunizations

All children must be up-to-date on their immunizations to attend SCS. If you have a medical exception, a personal exemption or a religious exemption as permitted by Oklahoma law and DHS guidelines, you must submit an immunization exemption certificate from the State of Oklahoma. If an outbreak of an illness occurs in the community, children whose immunizations are not up-to-date will not be allowed to attend SCS until so advised from the local Department of Health.

Rest

All children will be asked to lie down during quiet time, even if they do not usually fall asleep. Quiet, calm reflection and an opportunity to be alone is important in our busy world. While we will not force a child to lie down, we will encourage a period of quiet time on their cot. Each classroom will determine when a child that isn't napping can rise and engage in activities in our atelier or outside.

Nutrition

We serve well-balanced, nutritious meals at SCS. We do not serve fried foods or over-processed foods. We believe that the environment is crucial in the development of a young child and what foods are served and how they are grown and prepared is important. Meals are served in a family-style at the table or on a picnic blanket outside. Children serve themselves and help set the table and clean up after the meal.

Separation

For some children, coming to SCS will be their first time to spend a significant amount of time away from their home and family. This transition can bring both excitement and stress for both the child and the family. Below are a few suggestions to help the transition be smooth and pleasant for all.

Before School Begins

Attend the "Open House" day to allow your child to visit the school. Drive by and show them the school. Be casual about it, keeping discussions about school positive and matter-of-fact. If you believe your child may have difficulty separating, try not to allude to this in front of him/her. If your believe separation may be an issue, please discuss it with your child's teacher at "Open House" so that extra care and preparations can be made.

On the First Day...

Before coming to school, remind your child what is going to happen (who is taking them to school, who is picking them up). Make sure your goodbye is loving and brief. Please do not try to sneak out without saying goodbye. Avoid lingering for long periods of time, as this could suggest indecisiveness. You might gently suggest that your child draw or create a picture to share with you after school.

Pick-up and reviewing the day

Families are welcome to mingle in the gathering area at the school entrance during pick-up. School community is important and talking with other families is vital. Please remember that once you pick-up your child from their classroom, the teachers are not able to supervise in the gathering areas. When talking to your child about their day at school, we encourage questions about activities, "what did you have for lunch today?" or "Who did you play with outside?" You are encouraged to look at documentation within the classroom and in the gathering area to also help prompt discussions with your child. Classes will post pictures to kaymbu frequently to show you what students have been doing. These connections between what occurs at school and what is discussed (and possibly extended) at home are important to cognitive and social development.

Daily Clothing

We ask that you send a backpack/bag daily with the items suggested below or you can choose to leave these items at school and we will send them home when they have been used or need washing. Make it a habit to replenish your child's bag or check for proper items every day. If your child attends for full days, you may need to double the amount of clothes in the bag. It is better for us to have more clothes than necessary rather than not enough. Oklahoma seasonal transitions can be quite strange and unpredictable, so please consider this when packing your child's bag. We tend to get very dirty as well. Tuffo suits will be provided to each **child**. We also require that children have a pair of rain boots that will stay at school. We encourage children to dress and shoe themselves at school. It is important that your child is dressed with play in mind, and that they are able to pull her clothes on and off easily. Pants should have an elastic waistband if your child has not mastered button snaps yet. Shoes should have Velcro snaps or be a pull-on style. Laced shoes are discouraged, as most young children are not yet able to tie them.

Dressing for the Weather (Outside Play)

We spend a considerable portion of our day working and playing outside. The only time will not venture outside is during lightning, severe wind, severe freezing conditions or severe heat advisories. If it is 99 degrees, we go outside. If it is 100 degrees, we go outside. If it is raining or snowing, we go outside! With all this being said, we will be there right alongside your child. We want them to experience weather and nature. We want them to experience the diversity of the seasons in Oklahoma and learn to change their style of play according to the outdoor conditions. So that all of us can enjoy our time outside each day, each child's body must be properly protected from harsh weather conditions. We strongly encourage you to dress your child in natural fibers like wool and cotton because these fibers breathe rather than holding in moisture.

Logos & Lovies

Children are discouraged from wearing clothes with logos (Barbie, Hello Kitty, Thomas, Etc). Though SCS does not wholly oppose these figures, we prefer that the children have ample opportunity to play out of their own imaginations, rather than re-create movies and television. Lovies & blankies are welcomed at school as a comfortable friend during naptime. We recommend that lovies & blankies stay at school and not travel back-and-forth from home to school as no one wants to experience the dreaded "left our lovie at school" stress and tears.



Engaging Families

Scissortail Children's School is successful because families/faculty take the time to participate in activities, learning experiences, and school maintenance. This family involvement in the school is also valuable because it provides an imitative example for our children that will serve them as they grow to be stewards of the communities in which they live. Families have the opportunity to work with tasks associated with the upkeep of our school, the acquisition of materials and assisting with new projects of interest to the children of SCS. We have a family engagement area in the entry of the school. At the entrance, you will find current opportunities and events. Directly behind you, we have provided articles and other reading materials for you. Outside each classroom, you will find a shelf with a summary of the day's events. This is a wonderful way for you to be able to understand the happenings in the classroom so that you can carryover and extend conversations at home. Inside each classroom, you will find various forms of documentation on the walls/ shelves. Documentation not only captures moments of learning and creativity, it also serves a means of assessing progress and interests.
